Note 1: Chinese New Year Golden Week, Labour Day and National Day Golden Week are statutory holidays in the Mainland, lasting for seven, three and seven days respectively. Given the National Day Golden Week and the Mid-Autumn Festival were consecutive holidays in 2009 and 2012, the holidays lasted for eight days in these two years.

Note 2: Christmas Day is not a statutory holiday in the Mainland; therefore the above table only shows the Mainland visitor arrivals on December 25.
