

SES signs HKSAR/Greece Air Services Agreement

The Secretary for Economic Services, Ms Sandra Lee, today (May 31) signed an air services agreement on behalf of the Government of the Hong Kong Special Administrative Region (HKSAR) with the Government of the Hellenic Republic in Hong Kong.

Representing the Government of the Hellenic Republic at the signing ceremony was the Consul-General of Greece to the HKSAR, Mr George Veis.

"The air services agreement we signed today is an important milestone in our aviation relationship with Greece. It provides a legal framework for the establishment of air links between Hong Kong and Greece," said Ms Lee at the signing ceremony.

Ms Lee added that Hong Kong would continue to expand its air services network through negotiating agreements with new aviation partners and implementing the progressive liberalisation policy.

Including this agreement, the HKSAR has concluded air services agreements with 49 aviation partners.

Hong Kong has signed similar agreements with Australia, Austria, Bahrain, Bangladesh, Belgium, Brazil, Brunei, Cambodia, Canada, Czech Republic, Denmark, Estonia, Finland, France, Germany, Hungary, India, Indonesia, Israel, Italy, Japan, Luxembourg, Malaysia, Mauritius, Mongolia, Myanmar, Nepal, the Netherlands, New Zealand, Norway, Pakistan, Papua New Guinea, the Philippines, the Republic of Korea, Oman, Qatar, Russia, Singapore, South Africa, Sri Lanka, Sweden, Switzerland, Thailand, Turkey, the United Arab Emirates, the United Kingdom, the USA and Vietnam.
