park, and is actively pursuing its hotel development project. As for the Hong Kong Disneyland, a brand new, state-of-the-art night-time parade will welcome guests next year. It is also going to roll out a new Marvel-themed attraction in 2016 and is planning to build a new hotel on its existing site.

Ladies and gentlemen, these are just some examples of Hong Kong's tourism initiatives, and there are more to come to the delight of our visitors. Likewise, ITE is bringing in new elements each year to attract more participants. I must congratulate K S on bringing back this Expo again this year.
